Dear Parish Family
Kia Ora e te Whanau

The Service of Light

Celebrant: Bishop Peter Carrell

Priest: Fr Peter Beck

Cantor: Matthew Harris

Organ: Paul Ellis

The congregation gathers outside the west door for the blessing of the new fire and the traditional ceremonies of the Paschal Candle, then all enter the darkened church. The candle is carried in. Each time the procession stops, the priest sings:

Priest: Christ our Light. (*genuflect*)

Thanks be to God.

The Exsultet: *All stand for the Easter Proclamation:*

Fr Peter Williams

Rejoice, heavenly powers.

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels!

O universe, dance around God's throne!

Jesus Christ, our King, is risen!

Sound the victorious trumpet of salvation!

Rejoice, O earth, in glory, revealing the splendour of your creation,

Radiant in the brightness of your triumphant King!

Christ has conquered! Now his life and glory fill you!

Darkness vanishes for ever!

Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory!

The risen Saviour, our Lord of life, shines upon you!

Let all God's people sing and shout for joy.

The Lord be with you:

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts:

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is right and good that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise you, Father Almighty, the unseen God, through your only Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who has saved us by his death, paid the price of Adam's sin, and reconciled us once again to you.

Glory to you for ever.

For this is the Passover feast, when Christ the true Lamb of God is slain, whose blood consecrates the homes of all the faithful. **Glory to you for ever.**
 This is the night when you first saved our ancestors, freeing Israel from her slavery, and leading her safely through the sea. **Glory to you for ever.**
 This is the night when Jesus Christ vanquished hell, broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave. **Glory to you for ever.**
 This is the night when all who believe in him are freed from sin, restored to grace and holiness, and share the victory of Christ. **Glory to you for ever.**
 This is the night that gave us back what we had lost; beyond our deepest dreams you made even our sin a happy fault. **Glory to you for ever.**
 Most blessed of all nights, evil and hatred are put to flight and sin is washed away, lost innocence regained, and mourning turned to joy. **Glory to you for ever.**
 Night truly blessed, when hatred is cast out, peace and justice find a home, and heaven is joined to earth and all creation reconciled to you. **Glory to you for ever.**
 Therefore, heavenly Father, in this our Easter joy accept our sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering. Grant that this Easter candle may make our darkness light. **Glory to you for ever.**
 For Christ the morning star has risen in glory. Christ is risen from the dead and his flame of love still burns within us. Christ sheds his peaceful light on the world.
 Christ lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Liturgy of the Word

Each reading is followed by sung verses, pause, then a collect.

Cantor: What marvels the Lord has worked for us! Indeed we were glad.

Candles are extinguished. All stand in silence.

Priest: Christ is risen, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

People: He is risen indeed, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

The altar candles are lit, then all other lights come on. As the Gloria begins, the bells are rung.

**Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth.
 Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.
 Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.
 For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father.
 Amen.**

Collect:

Eternal Giver of life and light, this holy night shines with the radiance of the risen Christ. Renew your Church with the Spirit given to us in baptism, that we may worship you in sincerity and truth, and shine as a light in the world; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Epistle: *(sit)*

Romans 6: 3–11

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptised into Christ Jesus were baptised into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin.

But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church. **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm: (Cantor) 118

1. We give thanks to you, O Lord, for you are gracious and your love endures for ever. Let the house of Israel say: "God's love endures for ever."
2. The right hand of the Lord raises up, the right hand of the Lord does mighty things. I shall not die but live, and proclaim what the Lord has done.
3. The stone which the builders rejected has become the head of the corner. This is the Lord's doing, and it is marvellous in our eyes.

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.'

Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to Christ the Word.**

Led by the Paschal Candle, clergy and servers proceed to the font. Candles are lit. During this time the Cantor sings the Litany of the Saints.

The Thanksgiving over the Water

Priest:

Dear friends, Through the paschal mystery We have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life.

Now that we have completed our Lenten observance, we gather at this font to bless new water for baptism and to baptise Hugh our brother, making him a member of the Body of Christ, the Church. Hugh will then be confirmed in his commitment to Christian service by our Bishop. Then Mother Meg will call on us all to renew our baptismal promises.

Father, you give us grace through sacramental signs, which tell us of the wonders of your unseen power. In baptism we use your gift of water, which you have made a rich symbol of the grace you give us in this sacrament.

At the very dawn of creation your Spirit breathed on the waters, making them the well-spring of all holiness. The waters of the great flood you made a sign of the waters of baptism, that make an end of sin and a new beginning of goodness. Through the waters of the Red Sea you led Israel out of slavery, to be an image of God's holy people, set free from sin by baptism.

In the waters of the Jordan your Son was baptised by John and anointed with the Spirit. Your Son willed that water and blood should flow from his side as he hung upon the cross. After his resurrection he told his disciples: "Go out and teach all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

Father, look now with love upon your Church, and unseal for her the fountain of baptism. By the power of the Spirit give to the water of this font the grace of your Son. You created us in your own likeness: cleanse us from sin in a new birth of innocence by water and the Spirit.

May all who are buried with Christ in baptism rise also to newness of life. United in Christ, with all the baptised in earth and heaven, we worship you, O God, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing, honour and glory be yours.

The Baptism

Priest: God is love, God gives us life.

We love because God first loves us.

In baptism God declares that love;

in Christ God calls us to respond.

Sponsors: We present Hugh Robert Munro to be baptised and made a member of the Body of Christ, the Church.

Priest: Hugh, from the beginning the Church has received believers by baptism. On the day when the apostles first preached the Gospel of Christ's resurrection, Peter urged his hearers 'Repent and be baptised, every one of you, in the name of Jesus the Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God may call.' How do you respond to this promise?

Hugh: I hear God's call and come for baptism.

Priest: Do you renounce all evil influences and powers that rebel against God?

Hugh: I renounce all evil.

Priest: Do you trust in Christ's victory which brings forgiveness, freedom and life?

Hugh: In faith I turn to Christ my way, my truth, my life.

All: **May God keep you in the way you have chosen.**

Priest: Hugh, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, **Amen.**

God receives you by baptism into the Church, Child of God, blessed in the Spirit, welcome to the family of Christ.

Priest: We sign you with the cross, the sign of Christ.

A lighted candle is given to the newly baptised by a member of the congregation, who says:

Walk in the faith of Christ crucified and risen. Shine with the light of Christ.

Confirmation

The two confirmands are led to the Bishop.

Priest: Bishop Peter I present Hugh and Eyob to receive the laying on of hands to strengthen them for the work of God's Kingdom.

Bishop: Hugh/Eyob we welcome you as you come to be confirmed in the promises you made at your baptism.

The Affirmation

Bishop: Praise to God who has given us life. **Blessed be God for the gift of love.**
Praise to God who forgives our sin. **Blessed be God who sets us free.**
Praise to God who kindles our faith. **Blessed be God, our strength, our hope.**

Bishop: Hugh/Eyob, what is your faith?

Hugh/Eyob: I believe and trust in God the Father, maker and sustainer of all things; and in God the Son, my Saviour Jesus Christ, and in God the Holy Spirit, giver of life and truth. This is my faith.

Bishop: Hugh/Eyob, those who are baptised are called to worship and serve God. From the beginning, believers have continued in the apostles teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers. Will you commit yourself to this life?

Hugh/Eyob: I will, with God's help. Through God's grace, I will forgive others as I am forgiven; I will seek to love my neighbour as myself, and strive for peace and justice. I will accept the cost of following Jesus Christ in my daily life and work; with the whole Church I will proclaim by word and action the Good News of God in Christ.

The Laying on of Hands

Bishop: Let us pray for Hugh and Eyob who have declared their commitment to Christ's service.

Silence

Our help is in the name of the eternal God **who is making the heavens and the earth.**

Come Holy Spirit **bearing your gifts of grace.**

God of mercy and love, new birth by water and the Spirit is your gift, a gift that none can take away; grant that your servants may grow into the fulness of the stature of Christ. Fill them with the joy of your presence. Increase in them the fruit of your Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of love, patience and gentleness, the spirit of wonder and true holiness.

The Bishop lays hand(s) on Hugh and Eyob in turn in silence and then prays.

Creator Spirit, strengthen Hugh/Eyob with your gifts of grace, to love and serve as a disciple of Christ. Guide, protect, uphold him that he may continue yours forever. **Amen.**

Living God, empower your disciple to bring life to the world. **Amen! May we and they together be found in Christ and Christ in us.**

The Celebration of Faith

All stand and turn towards the font

Priest: Let us all renew our own baptismal covenant. Do you renounce all evil influences and powers that rebel against God?

I renounce all evil.

Do you trust in Christ's victory which brings forgiveness, freedom, and life?

In faith I turn to Christ, my way, my truth, my life.

What is your faith?

I believe and trust in God the Father, maker and sustainer of all things; and in God the Son, my Saviour Jesus Christ; and in God the Holy Spirit, giver of life and truth. This is my faith.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers? **R. I will, with God's help.**

Will you forgive others as you are forgiven? **R.**

Will you seek to love your neighbour as yourself, and strive for peace and justice? **R.**

Will you accept the cost of following Jesus Christ in your daily life and work? **R.**

With the whole Church will you proclaim, by word and action, the Good News of God in Christ? **R.**

God our creator, the rock of our salvation, we thank you for our new birth by water and the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of our sins, and for our fellowship in the household of faith with all those who have been baptised in your name; keep us faithful to the calling of our baptism, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The priest sprinkles the people with blessed water from the font. Candles are extinguished.

The First Mass of the Resurrection The Peace

Bishop: The peace of Christ be always with you. **And also with you.**

E te whanau, we are the body of Christ. **By one spirit we were baptised into one body.**

Keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace: **Amen. We are bound by the love of Christ.**

The Preparation of the Gifts

Priest: Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this bread to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made. It will become for us the bread of life. **Blessed be God for ever.**

By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ, who humbled himself to share in our humanity.

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this wine to offer, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become our spiritual drink. **Blessed be God for ever.**

Priest: Pray, sisters and brothers, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the almighty One.

May the Lord receive the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his Church.

Lord, accept the prayers and offerings of your people. With your help, may this Easter mystery of our redemption bring to perfection the saving work you have begun in us. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Great Thanksgiving

Bishop:

The Lord is here.

Lift up your hearts.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

God's Spirit is with us.

We lift them to the Lord.

It is right to offer thanks and praise.

Father, all-powerful and ever-living God, we do well always and everywhere to give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ your only Son. We praise you with greater joy than ever on this Easter night, when Christ became our Paschal sacrifice. You raised him to life triumphant over death; you exalted him in glory. By his victory over death the reign of sin is ended, a new age has dawned, a broken world is restored, and we are made whole once more. Therefore with the faithful who rest in him, with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing:

Sanctus & Benedictus: Cantor A Festive Eucharist Noel Rawsthorne

Bishop: All glory and thanksgiving to you, holy Father. Send your Holy Spirit, that these gifts of bread and wine which we receive may be to us the body and blood of Christ, and that we, filled with the Spirit's grace and power, may be renewed for the service of your kingdom. On the night before he died, your Son Jesus Christ took bread; when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them, and said: Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this as often as you drink it, to remember me.

Deacon: Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

Glorify to you, Lord Christ: your death we show forth; your resurrection we proclaim; your coming we await. Amen! Come, Lord Jesus.

Bishop: Therefore, loving God, recalling your great goodness to us in Christ, his suffering and death, his resurrection and ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and this cup of salvation. Accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving which we offer through Christ, our great high priest.

Hear the prayers of the family you have gathered here before you. In mercy and love unite all your children, wherever they may be. Welcome into your kingdom our departed brothers and sisters, and all who have left this world in your friendship. We hope to enjoy for ever the vision of your glory through Christ our Lord, from whom all good things come.

United in Christ with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, O God, in songs of everlasting praise:

**Blessing, honour and glory be yours, here and everywhere, now and for ever.
Amen.**

Bishop: Let us be still in the presence of God

The Communion

Bishop: As Christ teaches us we pray:

**Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil.

Bishop: We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

We who are many are one body, for we all share the one bread.

Agnus Dei: Cantor A Festival Eucharist Noel Rawsthorne

Bishop: Christ became our Paschal sacrifice.

Let us feast with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth, alleluia.

This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

Happy are we who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

Communion in one kind will be administered from the front step at the centre of the aisle. Please leave your seat by the side aisle, and approach the centre aisle from the rear crossing. Please leave a 2m distance between yourself and others and please use the hand sanitizer. When receiving the sacrament, please stretch your arms horizontally as much as possible.
