From the Priest-In-Charge

Dear Parish Family, Kia Ora e Te Whanau

Welcome to mass today as we celebrate the Assumption of Our Lady, whether you are here in person or joining us on live stream. Today I take my leave of you as your Interim Priest -in-Charge.
