

## The Second Sunday of Lent 16 March 2025

### From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

This week we have the second Sunday of Lent. There are two options given for our reading on this Sunday. Luke 13:31-35 or Luke 9:28-36. We have opted for the latter being the event of the Transfiguration. Why have we chosen the Transfiguration reading? As there is also a separate Feast of the Transfiguration on 6 August. Well, I am a big believer in Christian unity. The Transfiguration option is the reading shared by the majority of Christians, Roman Catholics and the like. And one of the great treasures of our tradition is the use of a lectionary, common readings shared by different Christian denominations. As we often have a lot of disagreement on things it is great that we have some things in common. I also extend this principle to the liturgy. I often have visitors to St Michael's from the Roman Catholic tradition who say how wonderful it is that our liturgy is similar There is a familiarity there that helps them feel at home and connected. Last year for example I was in Fiji for my honeymoon and attended the local Roman Catholic church for Mass. The service was in English with some Fijian used for the music. I was able to follow the service (they don't give you a service sheet so you have to know it!) and it was a wonderful experience. And though our prayer book does offer other liturgies which I think can be used from time to time or in a particular season there is something profound about this idea of common prayer. With so much division in the world it is wonderful that as Christians we can try and break down some of those long held divisions and seek unity, in whatever way we can.

To other matters. March is a busy month with lots of events happening. Of course, as a parish we have the all-important Annual General Meeting taking place after the 10am Mass on 23 March. This Sunday there will be a limited number of AGM reports available for those who don't have access to email or a computer. The AGM reports will then be sent out digitally so you all have time to read them before the meeting. On the AGM Sunday we will have hard copies available for those who attend the AGM. We also have nomination forms available in the church for Treasurer, People's Warden and Vestry. The AGM is open to all, however voting rights are available to those who have been on the Parish Roll for at least 2 months. Please come along and support the parish and the important decisions that are made.

**Gospel:** Luke 9:28-36 Fr Peter Williams

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking about his exodus, which he was about to fulfill in Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep, but as they awoke they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us set up three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah," not realizing what he was saying. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them, and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.
