

Dear friends,

This past week the St Michael's Church School students have returned for another year. We also seem to have finally been graced by some summer weather. In fact, as I saw the students walking in through the gate, I remembered my own experience of returning to school at the hottest time of the year! I look forward to another year of chaplaincy in our school community.

Parish news this week signals the start of some of our groups and ministries (many have already returned in January), please have a look at the notices for what is taking place. This Sunday also sees the return of our Evensong and Benediction service with a 'Festive Evensong' for Candlemas. If you haven't attended Evensong and Benediction at St Michael's before, please do come along and experience this beautiful service in the Anglican tradition.

As mentioned, this Sunday we celebrate the feast of Candlemas, known in the past as the Purification of the Blessed Virgin. The Feast is founded in the ancient religion of Israel. The feast is now called the Presentation of Our Lord and the emphasis is more on Jesus than on his mother. The blessing and the procession of candles, as well as the Scripture readings, focus on Jesus who is the "Light of the World".

Forty days after the birth of Christ, Mary complied with the precepts of the law, she redeemed her first-born from the temple (Numbers 18:15), and was purified by the prayer of Simeon the Just, in the presence of Anna the prophetess (Luke 2:22). Simeon's prayer which later became the Canticle Nunc Dimittis speaks of Jesus, the Incarnate Word of God, as divine revelation to the non-Jews and the glory of God's own people from whom he came. This Sunday we will reflect on and celebrate this important truth.

Greeting:

Forty two days ago we celebrated the joyful feast of the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Today we recall the holy day on which he was presented in the temple, fulfilling the law of Moses and at the same time going to meet his faithful people. Led by the Spirit, Simeon and Anna came to the temple, recognised Christ as their Lord, and proclaimed him with joy.

United by the Spirit, we gather now in the house of God to welcome Christ the Lord. Here we shall recognise him in the breaking of bread until he comes again in glory.

The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight, indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people.

Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

Luke 2: 22-40

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.'

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah.

Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying: Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word: for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel. And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him.

This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to Christ the Word.**
