

From the Vicar...

Dear Friends.

You will see in our notices this week mention of our upcoming Mission Impact Review. Please do take the time to read it as there is some important information about what the Review is about and how you will be involved.

This Sunday we are celebrating Corpus Christi or as it is now commonly known as The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This Feast was traditionally held on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday. But like a lot of churches now, we have transferred it to this Sunday so that we might celebrate this important Feast. The history of the Feast is an interesting one. It's institution began with St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon, in Belgium. She was born in 1193 at Retines near Liège. Orphaned at an early age, she was educated by the Augustinian nuns of Mont Cornillon. Here she in time made her religious profession and later became superioress. Intrigues of various kinds several times drove her from her convent. She died 5 April, 1258.

Juliana, from her early youth, had a great veneration for the Blessed Sacrament, and always longed for a special feast in its honour. She made known her ideas to her Bishop Robert de Thorete, then Bishop of Liège, and to Jacques Pantaléon, at that time Archdeacon of Liège, who later became Pope Urban IV.

Bishop Robert was favourably impressed, and, since bishops as yet had the right of ordering feasts for their dioceses, he called a synod in 1246 and ordered the celebration to be held in the following year, also, that a monk named John should write the Office for the occasion. Bishop Robert did not live to see the execution of his order, for he died 16 October, 1246; but the feast was celebrated for the first time by the canons of St. Martin at Liège. There is a legend that this act was inspired by a procession to Orvieto in 1263, after a priest Peter of Prague and his congregation witnessed a Eucharistic miracle of a bleeding consecrated host at Bolsena. This has been called into question by scholars who note problems in the dating of the miracle, whose tradition begins in the 14th century, and the interests of Urban IV, a former Archdeacon in Liège. Whatever its history we will gather this Sunday in an intentional way to give thanks for the Holy Eucharist that Christ instituted, which gives us life and strength.

Parish Mission Impact Review to take place on 19 and 20 July

The Diocese has reinstated five yearly parish reviews and, following discussions with Fr Jordan, it has been agreed that the Parish of St Michael and All Angels will be reviewed on the **weekend of 19 and 20 JULY.** A Mission Impact Review Team consisting of Rev Mark Chamberlain, Grant Adams (Parish of Avonhead) and Corinne Haines (Parish of Fendalton) will lead the review and interview a selected group of clergy and lay leaders. All members of the congregation will also be invited to complete a questionnaire about the current mission and ministry of the parish.

The purpose of the Mission Impact Review is to 'assess, affirm and challenge' parishes in their ministry and mission and is a snapshot of parish life. The Team will 'hold up a mirror' to the congregation to enable a process of stock taking and spiritual assessment. This is intended to be a sympathetic and encouraging process designed to strengthen the parish and move the parish toward a more intentional missional footing. From Sunday 6 July you will have the opportunity to complete the questionnaire. The

link will be emailed to you and you will have one week to complete it. If you don't have internet access, please complete a paper copy of the questionnaire. Fr Jordan will make this available. Please engage with this process prayerfully and thoughtfully.

Interviews will take place on Saturday 19 July and the reviewers will **attend worship** at St Michael's on Sunday 20 July. This will be followed by morning tea and the reviewers will then make a **presentation to the parish**. A report will then be written and sent to the Parish Vestry with observations and recommendations.
