

## From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

I was sent an interesting article last week about the rise of attendance to the Latin Mass by young people. The article focused on a Church in Melbourne where young people are flocking to church, and in some cases driving up to an hour to attend the only catholic Church in the Diocese that offers the Mass in Latin, also known as the Tridentine Rite. One young person when asked why they attended responded "Zoomers want authenticity more than anything, and I think you'll find it at a Latin Mass," Another when asked responded "It's divine and so uncompromising – you're witnessing something that's beyond your own feeble existence," 21-year-old Elisha Andres said.

"You can tell this mass is not about you, it's not about entertainment, it's really about the Lord." Often when I am talking to younger people they say are attracted to the mystery and beauty of the Mass here at St Michael's. Though we don't conduct our services in Latin (I am sure some would approve!) we do offer an alternative to a lot of churches in regards to worship and devotional life. It is a good reminder that we should treasure our tradition and even delve deeper into it. Young people are really seeking authenticity, stability and a sense of the numinous. As another young person was quoted in the article as saying "Young people are forming forms of belief in the modern context which has become very individualised, very fragmented, very difficult to know right from wrong." The challenge for us as a parish is to draw those younger people into the church to experience the beauty of holiness. So that they might find meaning, life and hope through the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ.

### **Parish Practices**
