Dear friends,

These past few days I have been up in Auckland attending the Religious Education and Chaplaincy Conference. This has participants from Anglican, Presbyterian and Methodist schools from around the country. It was an informative and stimulating conference where we covered topics such as a Maori Christian response to mātauranga Māori lead by Bishop Kito of Te Pihopatanga o Te Tai Tokerau (Auckland). We also covered using art and creativity in sharing the Gospel with children and discussing science and faith in our schools. We then had a keynote speech from former journalist and now executive director of the Maxim Institute, Tim Wilson. Tim spoke of his career in journalism and coming to faith in the Roman Catholic Church and how that changed his life direction. And of course, like many such gatherings it was a great opportunity to connect with colleagues from around New Zealand over good food.

Next week is the annual Anglo-Catholic Hui being held in Dunedin. Fr Simon and I will both be attending the Hui and so will not be in the office on Thursday 15 and Friday 16 August. The Hui is always a great opportunity to connect with those of our tradition and to be informed and inspired. I know there are some parishioners attending from St Michael's which is great. I do extend the invitation to those who may still wish to come. This Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of Alana Pidgeon. Please do join us at the 10am service to support her in this next step of her Christian life. The following Sunday we celebrate the Assumption of St Mary, which is transferred from the Thursday. Do join us for that important Feast in the life of the church.

The Baptism of Alana Pidgeon

E te whānau a te Karaiti / Dear friends in Christ,
God is love, God gives us life. We love because God first loves us. In baptism God declares that love; in Christ God calls us to respond.

Who do you present for baptism?

Sponsors say:

We present Alana to be baptised and made a member of the Body of Christ, the Church.

From the beginning the Church has received believers by baptism. Believers' children have also been baptised so that with help and encouragement they should grow up in Christ and by the grace of God serve Christ all the days of their life. On the day when the apostles first preached the Gospel of Christ's resurrection, Peter urged his hearers 'Repent and be baptised, every one of you, in the name of Jesus the Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God may call.'

How do you respond to this promise?

The candidate replies:

I hear God's call and come for baptism.

Do you renounce all evil influences and powers that rebel against God?

The candidate says:

I renounce all evil.

Do you trust in Christ's victory which brings forgiveness, freedom, and life?

The candidate says:

In faith I turn to Christ, my way, my truth, my life.

All: May God keep you in the way you have chosen.

Do you believe in God the Father?

All: I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Praise God who made heaven and earth,

All: whose promise endures for ever.

We thank you God for your love in all creation,

especially for your gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.

We thank you for your covenant with your people Israel;

through the Red Sea waters you led them to freedom in the promised land. In the waters of the Jordan your Son was baptised by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit.

Through the deep waters of death Jesus fulfilled his baptism.

He died to set us free and was raised to be exalted Lord of all.

It is Christ who baptises with the Holy Spirit and with fire.

All: Amen. Come Holy Spirit.

We thank you that through the waters of baptism you cleanse us, renew us by your Spirit and raise us to new life.

In the new covenant we are made members of your Church and share in your eternal kingdom.

Through your Holy Spirit, fulfil once more your promises in this water of rebirth, set apart in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

All: Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom, thanksgiving and honour, power and might, be to our God for ever and ever.

Amen!

The candidate is baptised with the words:

Alana, I baptise you
in the name of the Father,
and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.

*The priest makes the sign of the cross on the baptised with oil set apart for this purpose
by the Bishop, saying:*

We sign you with the cross,
the sign of Christ.

A lighted candle is given to the baptised with the words:

Walk in the faith of Christ
crucified and risen. Shine with the light of Christ.

Let us welcome the newly baptised:

**All: God receives you by baptism
into the Church.**

**Child of God,
blessed in the Spirit,
welcome
to the family of Christ.**

We sing Jesus Christ is risen. Alleluia!

Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy: welcome them into the light of your presence.
