From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

With the school holidays well under way it is quieter around St Michael's this week, and certainly less traffic on the roads! It was a joy to be able to welcome our new school principal Liz Coster at two services last week. Please continue to pray for Liz as she takes up the new role and prepares for the upcoming term. Next year marks a significant milestone in the life of the Parish and School as we celebrate our 175th Anniversary. Work is underway to celebrate this significant event which will consist of alumni gatherings and special services. A joint committee between the school and church is preparing promotional material and we will send this out for distribution soon. It will be a great opportunity to acknowledge and give thanks to all those who left us with such an enduring legacy here at St Michael and All Angels.

You would have hopefully received an email announcing Deacon Robert's Ordination as Priest, taking place on Friday 8 August at 7pm. Deacon Robert was due to be ordained in November, marking a year since his ordination as Deacon. However, Bishop Peter will be on study leave in November and so asked that it be brought forward. Please keep Deacon Robert in your prayers as he prepares to be ordained as a Priest.

This Sunday's Gospel is Luke 10:25-37 which is the well-known story of the Good Samaritan. We might say the core of the Christian message is:

- faith as total trust in God and his message that comes through Christ in the New Testament;
- love as the driving power of all our actions and relationships.

We cannot have one without the other. As the Apostle James says in his Letter: ...faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. (James 2:17)

Some people tend to be very concerned about orthodoxy, about thinking and saying the right thing in conformity with the Church's teaching, but there can be no orthodoxy without orthopraxis, as the example of the Pharisees makes clear. Faith which does not express itself in love is Pharisaism. Christian faith truly lived results in a bonding with people everywhere. It is a living out of the prayer, "Our Father". Join us this Sunday as we seek to strengthen our faith through the Eucharist in order to be equipped for our work in God's world.

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37 Deacon Robert Jamieson An expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strongth and with all your mind and your neighbor as

your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself." And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

But wanting to vindicate himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and took off, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while traveling came upon him, and when he saw him he was moved with compassion. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, treating them with oil and wine. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him, and when I come back I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to Christ the Word.**
