The Fourth Sunday of Lent Mothering Sunday 30 March 2025

From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

This Sunday we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Lent, which actually goes by a few different names. It coincides with what is known as Laetare Sunday, which comes from the traditional introit for the day (the opening song/chant of the Mass) which begins 'Laetare Hierusalem et conventum' meaning 'Rejoice ye with Jerusalem'. It is also called Mid-Lent Sunday or Refreshment Sunday, a day of respite from fasting halfway through the penitential season of Lent. And of course, as we celebrate today, Mothering Sunday. This Sunday's association with mothering originates in the texts read during the Mass in the Middle Ages, appearing in the lectionary in sources as old as the 8th century. These include several references to mothers and metaphors for mothers.

Mothering Sunday in the United Kingdom is the equivalent of Mother's Day here in New Zealand. At some stage as the British Empire gave way to the Commonwealth, New Zealand adopted the American date, now celebrated widely. Interestingly enough though we celebrate Father's Day at the start of spring - as do Australia, Papua New Guinea and Fiji - the UK and the US celebrate dads on the third Sunday in June! Slightly confusing.

We gather today to do three things. To celebrate our life together as Church and School, a shared history of nearly 175 years (2026 will be our 175th). Secondly to celebrate Motherhood in all its forms, those times when motherly love has been shown to us by others, and of course to recognise the love of our own mothers. And thirdly, upholding that old tradition were people returned to their 'mother church' on this fourth Sunday of Lent. Because for the children of our school St Michael's will always be their mother church. Wherever they go and whatever they do they will always be a part of this church community, and so will you all.
