From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

We have begun the Advent Season which calls us to wait and prepare as we approach the great Feast of the Nativity. At this time of the year, it is a big challenge to focus on what the season is actually about and what the Nativity really means for us as Christians. And so, despite the often-confronting nature of the readings and themes of Advent in some sense they 'wake us' up to the true meaning of the season, the profound message that Jesus is Emmanuel, 'God with us.' May we have a deep sense of that message as we move through Advent and towards Christmas.

I write this letter on what is in fact *International Volunteers Day,* the 5 December. Parishioner Carol Fraser highlighted the importance of this day during the week and kindly provided how much volunteers are the backbone of the parish of St Michael and All Angels. And so, I want to acknowledge the amazing work so many of you do here at church and how we could not do it without you. Gospel: Luke 3: 1–6 Deacon Robert Jamieson

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judæa, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituræa and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness.

He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah: The voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'
