

From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

In his letter this week Bishop Peter spoke about The Royal Commission on Abuse's final report which has now been presented to the Government. The Commission has recently published a news release. The publication of the whole report will be on Wednesday, 24 July 2024. There will be a statement from our Archbishops in response to the report and its findings. If you or anyone you know needs support with the release of the report please don't hesitate to be in touch. Though the report will be damning about the church's role in historic abuse it will also be an opportunity to lament and ensure the church is a safe place now and in the future.

This weekend the parish will be hosting members of the Cambridge Christ's College Chapel Choir as they perform here at St Michael's this Sunday 21 June at 2pm. Do come along and support the choir as well as hear some beautiful music! Don't forget also that the Anglo-Catholic Hui is fast approaching, taking place on 15—17 August in Dunedin.

The theme of our readings for this Sunday is Jesus as the model of a good shepherd. We see him teaching, healing and, in the continuation of today's Gospel next week, feeding. At the opening of the Gospel, we see Jesus inviting his disciples to go with him to a quiet place to rest and have some quiet. Yet, when they get to their chosen destination, they find that the crowds have gone ahead of them and are awaiting their arrival.

We see here an example of the kind of tension that exists in the life of every committed Christian. On the one hand, there is the need to draw away to a quiet place and to recharge one's batteries, to reflect on and evaluate what one has been doing and to regenerate one's spiritual energy. At the same time, there are constant demands on our commitment to serve. As we gather for the Eucharist this Sunday may we be nourished by the Christ and be empowered to serve those in need.

Parish Practices

Health & Safety Regulations: In an emergency, use the closest exit and assemble in the drop-off zone. In an earthquake, drop down and shelter behind or under a pew, covering your head. Follow instructions.

On the night before he died, your Son Jesus Christ took bread; when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them, and said: Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this as often as you drink it, to remember me.

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

**Glory to you, Lord Christ: your death we show forth;
your resurrection we proclaim; your coming we await.
Amen! Come, Lord Jesus.**

Therefore, loving God, recalling your great goodness to us in Christ, his suffering and death, his resurrection and ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and this cup of salvation. Accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving which we offer through Christ, our great high priest.

Remember, Lord, your Church, spread throughout the world, and bring her to the fullness of charity, together with Peter our Bishop and all who minister in your name. Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy: welcome them into the light of your presence.
