Dear friends, I have been on annual leave for the past week and a half as I celebrated my 40th birthday on the 28th May. Natalia and I had a wonderful time away in Arthur's Pass walking the many beautiful tracks and enjoying the stillness of the mountains. When you are amongst such stunning panoramas you truly feel close to God. This was certainly my experience. It made me aware, as it has many times in my life of the importance of 'getting away from it all' and experiencing the stillness and grandeur of God's exquisite creation. It is however also good to be back into the routines of life and work and of course to be back and a part of the worshipping community of St Michael's.

This Sunday at the 10am Mass we have a combined service with the school. This is known as our Founders Day service. This is an opportunity to celebrate our history and our continued partnership. And most importantly to remember and give thanks to all those who founded St Michael and All Angels and the legacy they left us. Come and join us as we celebrate this important occasion.

At the 10am Mass we will have different readings which focus on the theme of foundation. At the 8am Mass we will have our usual readings from the lectionary for the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time. This year's Gospel is Mark and this week our reading is from chapter 3 verses 20-35.

In this Gospel reading, we see a good example of 'inclusion', where one story is contained inside another and both are complementary. The 'outer' story is about the contrast between people who are 'inside' and those who are 'outside'. The 'inner' story is about what puts people 'outside' – their refusal to listen to Jesus. The passage tells of two very different reactions to Jesus, one negative and the other positive. We will reflect on this interesting passage at the 8am Mass and its implications for our lives and ministry.

Parish Practices

Affirmation of Faith:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

The Great Thanksgiving

Therefore, loving God, recalling your great goodness to us in Christ, his suffering and death, his resurrection and ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and this cup of salvation. Accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving which we offer through Christ, our great high priest.

Remember, Lord, your Church, spread throughout the world, and bring her to the fullness of charity, together with Peter, our Bishop, and all who minister in your name.

Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy: welcome them into the light of your presence.

United in Christ with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, O God, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing, honour and glory be yours, here and everywhere, now and for ever. Amen.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.
