From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

This week I am attending an event celebrating the 175th anniversary of the founding of Canterbury hosted by the Rolleston family. In December 1850, the first wave of 750 settlers arrived at Lyttelton in a fleet of four ships and established what came to be known as the Canterbury Province. This event will acknowledge that milestone and the founding of the region. Of course, St Michael's will also be celebrating a similar milestone next year as we give thanks for 175 years of our church and school. You will see in the notices this week an event for school alumni in February next year. If you or anyone you know was involved with St Michael's Church school over the years, please do have a look and respond. The Church will also be hosting some celebrations with the school in 2026 for Founders Day and of course the Feast of St Michael and All Angels. We hope to send out some correspondence about these events before the end of the year.

We are coming very close to the end of the Church year. In fact, next Sunday, when we will celebrate the feast of Christ the King, is also the 34th and last Sunday of the liturgical year. So, as usual at this time, the Church invites us to think about the final end of things. Our world, in which we spend so much time planning and securing our worldly future, is only temporary we are told. The plans we make must always be contingent and conditional and take our final destiny into account. In this Sunday's passage from Luke's Gospel, we find Jesus in the Temple at Jerusalem. It is quite near the end of his public life. It is here that Jesus speaks of the destruction of the temple. Jesus, of course, was absolutely right. As the result of a rebellion by the Jews against the Romans, Jerusalem was besieged and the city and Temple utterly destroyed.

The unthinkable had happened. And for many Jews, including Jews converted to Christianity, it must have seemed like the end of the world. The early writings of the Christian Testament are very much concerned with what they believed was the imminent end of the world and the return of Christ in judgement. They were wrong, as we know, and even before the Christian Testament was completed, its later books indicate that the end is not so soon. The emphasis shifted from expectation of an early return of Jesus, to focusing on how to fruitfully spend the time of waiting. As we gather for Eucharist this Sunday, we will reflect on these important but challenging words.

Gospel: Luke 21:5-19 Fr Jordan Greatbatch

When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, "As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down."

They asked him, "Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?" And he said, "Beware that you are not led astray, for many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is near!' Do not go after them.

"When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified, for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earthquakes and in various places famines and plagues, and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven.

"But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. This will give you an opportunity to testify. So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance, for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and siblings, by relatives and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls.

This is the Gospel of Christ. Praise to Christ the Word.
