From the Vicar...

Dear friends,

I don't know about you, but I am struggling to believe it is November already. It seems that once you go past the half year mark, time begins to move at a great pace. November is always a significant month with the Feasts of All Saints and All Souls. Now that we have celebrated All Saints Sunday and All Souls, in a few weeks' time we will celebrate the feast of Christ the King on 24 November. Since the liturgical reforms of the 20th century this service is the last Sunday before the season of Advent. There are quite a few events taking place in the next few weeks. For us as a church community we have the ordination to Deacon of our incoming curate Robert on 23 November. The next day we will welcome him and his family at our Sunday Mass, followed by a morning tea in the hall. Please do join us for these important events. We will also be beginning the season of Advent with our service of Carols and Readings on Sunday 1 December at 7pm. A service of delightful music and a time to reflect on the incoming season with joy, hope and expectation.

Last week there was no letter due to me being unwell for a few days, sorry about that. A few weeks ago, we had an introduction from Robert. This week, I thought, I would continue with some reflections on the church and liturgy from an Anglo-Catholic perspective. Whenever we start Mass, we always begin with the Invocation and Sign of the Cross. This is to invoke the name of God the Holy Trinity as a self-defining statement that we are gathering as Christians, in communion with the one true God whom we worship. We move from this to The Greeting. The classic greeting translated from the Latin to English is 'The Lord be with you' with the response 'and with your (thy) spirit'. Modern translations vary but the NZPB puts the response as 'the Lord bless you'. It comes to us from St Paul. Having set the context by proclaiming that we meet 'in the name' of God the Holy Trinity, we greet each other as we embark on the liturgy together. The greeting establishes everything that follows as a shared and enacted dialogue, not a stage-performance, passively received in the pews. With this done we will look at next time.

In the third year of King Cyrus a word was revealed to Daniel: at that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence.

But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church. Thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm: 16 R. Preserve me, O God, for in you I have taken refuge.

Second Reading: (sit) Hebrews 10:11–25 Marla Hughes

Every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the right hand of God,' and since then has been waiting 'until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.' For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us, for after saying, 'This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds', he also adds, 'I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more.' Where there is for-giveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.

Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down." When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?"

Sermon: Fr Peter Beck
